From Pastor Jordan:

Thank you for your willingness to learn about our siblings in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (the ELCJHL or the Palestinian Lutheran church) during Lent, and to hold them in your prayers. The people of Palestine, especially those in the ELCJHL, hold a special place in my heart, and it means so much to me to help you learn to care about them and advocate for them.

I am pleased to tell you that St. Mary's website will have a new section where you can continue to learn more about the Palestinian Lutheran Church, stay up-to-date on their activities, and support their ministries. The page on the website will include the links below, as well as additional resources to learn from and ways to advocate for justice and peace in Palestine and Israel.

The people of the ELCJHL are a vibrant, faithful, resilient community of indigenous Christians in the Holy Land. They live out their faith every day under the many challenges of the Israeli military occupation of Palestine. In the words of one young Palestinian Christian, the people of the ELCJHL believe that Jesus walked the land of Palestine, and Jesus is still with us (the Christians of Palestine) now.

The ELCJHL has about 2,000 members who worship among 6 congregations throughout the West Bank and in Amman, Jordan. Additionally, the ELCJHL operates an Environmental Education Center, a gender justice desk, a youth ministry program, 4 kindergarten-12th grade schools in the West Bank, and a diaconal ministry program.

Students at the ELCJHL's 4 schools participate in activities like model United Nations, where teams travel in Palestine and beyond to compete in tournaments.

The ELCJHL's vibrant youth ministry gives young Palestinian Christians a chance to connect with each other and their faith, as well as experience travel to other countries, including the United States.

As American Lutheran Christians, we can support the Palestinian Lutheran Church through learning and sharing their stories, holding them in our prayers, and donating financially. It means a lot to the people of the ELCJHL to know that people across the world are advocating for justice and

peace, and accompanying them from around the world.

The Congregation Council shall be the board of directors of this congregation, and as such shall be responsible for maintaining and protecting its property and the management of its business and fiscal affairs.

The Congregation Council shall normally meet once a month.

Additionally, a congregation council member will be a liaison to one of the ministry teams providing monthly updates on the ministry at the monthly council meeting.



PATHWAYS to Promise

Dear friends,

I will be offering a free **Companionship workshop on Thursday, June 19th from 9:30 am to 2 pm at Lord of Life Lutheran Church, 5601 Washington Road.** Those that volunteer or are thinking about volunteering in the community/neighborhood would benefit from the training.

The Companionship workshop is a Pathways to Promise program, a multifaith and multicultural mental health support organization. The program was developed in 1987 by Rev. Craig Rennebohm and others. It aims to address the need for comprehensive mental health support for individuals living with mental health conditions and their support networks. The model is rooted in our natural capacities to be sensitive, compassionate, and concerned for another person in distress.

We use this workshop to educate faith and health working leaders with practices, guidelines, and settings by responding relationally to others who are experiencing difficult times (isolation, loneliness, suffering, homelessness) and in need of healing support.

The session's goals are:

- To inform Faith and Health work leaders about the various challenges individuals face when they are in distress.
- To equip Faith and Health work leaders with five practices of Hospitality, Neighboring, Journeying Side by Side, Listening, and Accompaniment, and demonstrate how to integrate these practices when responding to individuals in need of healing and recovery.
- To train Faith and Health working leaders to utilize their natural abilities to establish relationships with people, especially in the fast pace of life and walking with someone facing a mental health challenge.

To emphasize the significance of healthy relationships for good mental health and well-being and to promote self-care for leaders.

Both services' orders of worship will be the same, except when we celebrate a *Holden Evening Prayer* service on Saturday and a **CONTEMPORARY LED SERVICE ON SUNDAY**. Worship materials include using the ELW hymnal, printed bulletins, announcement sheets, etc. Printed material available online at our church's website under "uploaded bulletins, announcements".

ASSISTING MINISTERS An assisting minister is a liturgical leader who assists the congregation in worship and alongside the presiding minister throughout the worship service. Assisting ministers proclaim the word of God in prayer and scripture readings, receive offerings, pray for the concerns of the church and the world. They stand at the font helping welcome new Christians and help distribute the bread and wine. Assisting ministers send the congregation into the world for mission. **You do not need to sing.**

HOLY COMMUNION at the railing or from your seat as needed; once a month, communion will be by intinction. Gluten-Free/regular wafer, wine/juice offered. Children who haven't received instruction yet, or anyone may come forward for a blessing instead. Simply fold your hands when approaching.


When You Are Sick in Mind, Body, Spirit:


