A Message from Our Pastor The Rev. Dr. Jordan Miller-Stubbendick—November, 2025

This morning, I pulled my kids' lightweight jackets out of the closet for them to wear to school. When I get up in the morning now, it is dark and chilly outside. I love this time of year, where autumn is settling upon us, where you can almost feel our part of the Earth rotating away from the sun and toward the winter.

I am grateful to live in a part of the world where we have seasons. Each year, we get to see the gifts (and challenges) that each season of the year brings. We don't love every part of every season, but they can teach us to notice what is, right now, knowing that it will eventually change.

November feels like a transition point. We are solidly in the season of fall. Winter is coming, but it is not here yet. This is a liminal time and space, a doorway from what has been, passing into what is to be.

Perhaps this November could be an invitation for us to take stock of our spirits and how we are with God. Before the holidays begin, and we are swept up into the whirlwind of preparing, before we turn around and it is January and we are exhausted, we can take some time now to check in, with God and with our own souls.

This can be a really lovely gift to give yourself. Make a cup of coffee or tea, maybe light a candle, and sit somewhere comfortable. Allow vourself to settle in and think back over the year. You can use some of these questions as a starting point, or allow your own questions to guide you.

- -What have you and God walked through together?
- -What are some good parts of the year?
- -Where have there been tough spots?
- -What are your hopes going forward?
- -What do you want to keep about how you are showing up in the world? What do you want to change?

On a daily basis, I invite you to consider, What is one small, good thing about today? I love doing this. It can shift my perspective on a challenging day. As my dad used to say, "Not every day is a good day, but there is some good in every day." I have been encouraged in this practice by reading and really enjoying the book Daily Glimmers by Bridget McNulty.

Some of my the good things in my days recently include:

- -Watching the leaves of one maple tree on my block change color from the outside in
- -Sitting on the floor on Blue House books with one child on either side, all reading our books
- -Adam and I laughing about a small, shared memory and feeling grateful for our long history together
- -Offering communion to each person at the altar rail, feeling so grateful to say that this is the body of Christ, given for you

I hope that you can take some time to sit with God and sift through what this year has been for you so far. I hold you in my prayers as you do so. May you be held in God's eternal love and guidance, today and always.


These combined worship services also allow us to take an offering that benefits the wider community, as follows:





A Message from Pastor Jordan:

There has been ongoing conversation recently about whether to include people's last names in the prayers of the people during worship. We know that only using first names can lead to unwanted confusion about who is being prayed for.

However, unless those on the prayer list specifically request otherwise, St. Mary's uses only first names to protect people's privacy. This way, those on the prayer list can decide if and when they want to share their stories with others. People on the prayer list come both from St. Mary's and from the wider community.

If you hear a familiar name on the list, you are welcome to directly ask the person what is going on. Please don't ask the pastors, Nurse Sue, or the office staff for updates on the prayer list.

We want to respect people's privacy and steward their stories with care. We trust those on the prayer list to exercise their own agency about whether they wish to share details of their own stories. We trust that the St. Mary's community will offer prayer whether or not we know the specifics of what is happening with those on the prayer list.

Thanks for your understanding, and your continued prayer for those you know and those you do not know. Those on the prayer list appreciate it!
